The Gardens celebrates all things Australian

With Australia Day just around corner, the Australian National Botanic Gardens are gearing up to celebrate all things Australian – Australian music, Australian dancing, Australian people and Australian native plants.

Kicking off at 6.00pm this Saturday, the *Wedded Bliss* will set the weekend's mood with their unique blend of blues, country and jazz at the Gardens' popular *Summer Sounds* concert series. The band will be joined by *Folk Dance Canberra* who are guaranteed to get the audience up on their feet.

"This weekend is expected to be the biggest of the 2012 *Summer Sounds* concert series so far," the Gardens' Visitor Services Manager, Stephen Speer said.

"We've got a great line-up of music and dance entertainment and we are having an extra special Australia Day concert on Sunday – so bring your Aussie flag, your esky and your very best singing voice!"

On Sunday, the popular and highly entertaining *Annie and the Armadillos* will set the scene for the special Australia Day concert. Annie Sloane and her band will be joined by leading Indigenous performance troupe *Wiradjuri Echo*, who will treat the audience to a showcase of traditional and modern Indigenous dances.

"Being surrounded by one-third of Australia's known native plants, what better place to celebrate a very Australian weekend than at the Australian National Botanic Gardens," said Mr Speer.

The Summer Sounds concert series is held on the Eucalypt Lawn every Saturday and Sunday in January from 6:00 – 7:30pm. The event concludes with a big finale on 28 and 29 January with double the entertainment, commencing at 4.30pm.

Entry is by donation and a complimentary assistance bus from the Gardens' car park to the Eucalypt Lawn is provided by Peter Blackshaw Real Estate.

Cold bar sales, sizzling barbeque and gourmet ice-cream is available for purchase with proceeds going to the Friends of the Australian National Botanic Gardens and the Rotary and Lions Clubs.
